

What should you do if you're asked to fix a competition, and what are the consequences?

In accordance with Chapter B: IBU Code of Conduct, Rule 8 of the Integrity Code, you must report any knowledge or suspicions of rule violations and cooperate fully with investigations.

If you're asked to fix a competition

Follow these guidelines:

- First of all, reject the approach.
- Save all information regarding the identity of the person that approached you (name, any contact details etc.). This information will be very helpful during further investigation.
- Report a suspected breach of any governance, ethics or integrity regulations or provisions of the Biathlon Integrity Unit.

What are the consequences?

Did you know that match-fixing is not only forbidden in Biathlon but could also lead to significant consequences, including:

- Bans (up to lifetime) from Biathlon
- Fines
- Long-term negative impact on the reputation of a biathlete and of the sport of Biathlon in general
- Loss of sponsorship contracts and other sources of revenue.
